



DECEMBER

This is the time of the year the trees are dormant. For the most part, there is very little that will need to be done with the trees during the winter. Depending on your winter storage conditions, some caretaking activities will need to be addressed. If the trees are exposed to the elements and rain, watering will not be a concern. If your trees are sheltered from rain, then watering will be an issue that you will need to consider depending on the temperatures. There is measurable metabolic activity going on with trees when temperatures are above 40 degrees. Though your trees can survive in a completely dark environment, they would perform better if they had sunshine. Recent research indicates some trees photosynthesize through their bark during the winter. Also trees in a polyhouse will warm up during daylight hours when there is sunshine. If this is your first year using a polyhouse, contact one of the other members experienced using these structures.

In the winter, food can become scarce for many animals. Deer, rabbits, and small rodents such as mice may find the buds and bark of your tiny trees to be a food source. Take precautions.

Wind is a factor that can desiccate trees. If you have a tree in development and the branches are not refined, it is more tolerant of strong winds than the tiny twigs on refined trees. Roots, however, are the most

susceptible part of a tree with cold temperatures. In the natural environ-

ment, the ground buffers the freezing temperatures for roots. With bonsai, because the trees are in tiny pots above the ground, the roots are susceptible to death in subfreezing temperatures.

Keeping the trees heeled in and sitting on the ground can protect them. Make sure that you do not sit the tree directly on the ground or grass. The drainage holes can become plugged, and the roots will stay too wet. Consider placing landscape fabric, gravel, or mulch under the pot to ensure that the drain holes stay open.

If you keep your trees in an unheated garage, be careful that you are not fooled with watering needs of the trees by the moisture on the surface soil. There will be no wind or sun to evaporate the surface moisture. However, the roots in the soil will utilize small amounts of water, when temperatures get above 40 degrees. It can be a real challenge to water the trees in this environment. You do not want to keep them too wet, nor do you want to keep them too dry.

If you can, provide fans for air circulation in enclosed structures to reduce risk of fungus and disease.






