# BONSAI BASICS Demonstration with Bob Grealish

Living in Southwestern Pennsylvania allows for an appreciation of all the seasons, including winter. This year, winter seems to be unrelenting, especially for bonsai enthusiasts. Phone conversations with and email from your snowbird relatives are not helpful in maintaining your steely resolve not to disturb your trees in their winter shelter. The light is different; birds are chirping songs of courtship and you wonder whether to roll back the poly covering.

Remember that averages in March are a high of 49 and a low of 30 degrees. These are up 12 degrees from February and 15 degrees from January. We have seen a March day as warm as 84 and a morning as cold as minus one, however below zero is rare in March and has never occurred after the 15th of the month. We can expect to see the sun 43% of the possible time in March.



March is a busy month for the bonsai enthusiast, and on the warm days, roll back the poly coverings, inspect the trees for critter damage, water judiciously, and secure the covering for the cold nights. Take the time to scrub down the display stands. If you have trudged the woods at Uncle Harry's farm, noted the location of possible bonsai candidates, done some preliminary rootball cutting with a shovel last fall, then consider "lifting" the tree between March 15 and 21st. It will survive with the whole growing season ahead of it.

The 15th is a good time to start your feeding program for the indoor bonsai, especially Ficus. If you didn't get all your bonsai-related gifts at Christmas, now's the time to call Bob Dietz at Bonsai in the Burgh!






